| 2) A grocery store ordered 953 bottles of regular soda and 128 bottles of diet soda. To the nearest ten, what is the total number of bottles the store ordered?   | ten<br>$950 + 130$<br>1080 | hundred<br>$953 + 128$<br>$1081 = 1080$ | 2. <u>1,080</u> |
| 3) Katie was preparing for a marathon. In the morning she jogged 640 meters and in the afternoon she jogged another 623 meters. To the nearest ten, how many meters did she jog total?                                | ten<br>$640 + 620$<br>1260 | hundred<br>$640 + 623$<br>$1263 = 1260$ | 3. <u>1,260</u> |
| 4) An apple orchard was split into two sections. The first had 134 trees and the second had 159. To the nearest hundred, how many trees were there total in the orchard?  | ten<br>$100 + 200$<br>300  | hundred<br>$134 + 159$<br>$293 = 300$   | 4. <u>300</u>   |
| 5) For lunch, 956 students selected chocolate milk and 703 selected regular milk. To the nearest ten, how many milks were taken total?  | ten<br>$960 + 700$<br>1660 | hundred<br>$956 + 703$<br>$1659 = 1660$ | 5. <u>1,660</u> |
| 6) At a hotdog eating contest, in the first round 360 hotdogs were eaten and in round two another 437 were eaten. To the nearest hundred, how many hotdogs were eaten total?  | ten<br>$400 + 400$<br>800  | hundred<br>$360 + 437$<br>$797 = 800$   | 6. <u>800</u>   |
| 7) Oliver was playing games at the arcade. He won 242 tickets from the basketball game and 103 tickets from whack-a-mole. To the nearest hundred, how many tickets did he get total?                                  | ten<br>$200 + 100$<br>300  | hundred<br>$242 + 103$<br>$345 = 300$   | 7. <u>300</u>   |
| 8) Carl and Amy were collecting cans for recycling. Carl collected 756 cans and Amy collected 910. To the nearest hundred, what is the total number of cans they collected?   | ten<br>$800 + 900$<br>1700 | hundred<br>$756 + 910$<br>$1666 = 1700$ | 8. <u>1,700</u> |
| 9) An ice cream shop sold 593 chocolate cones and 129 vanilla cones. To the nearest hundred, how many cones did the ice cream shop sell all together?   | ten<br>$600 + 100$<br>700  | hundred<br>$593 + 129$<br>$722 = 700$   | 9. <u>700</u>   |
| 10) The classes in the fourth grade were counting the fundraiser money they earned. Mr. Smith's Class earned 283 dollars and Mrs. White's class earned 156 dollars. To the nearest ten, how much did they earn total? | ten<br>$280 + 160$<br>440  | hundred<br>$283 + 156$<br>$439 = 440$   | 10. <u>440</u>  |
