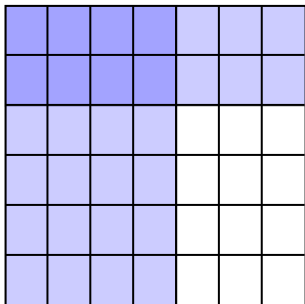


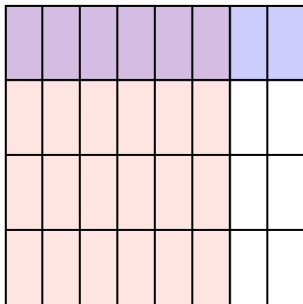


Use the box provided to show a visual example of how to multiply two fractions.

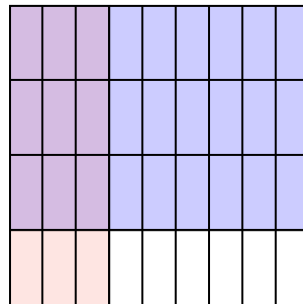
Ex) $\frac{4}{7} \times \frac{2}{6} =$



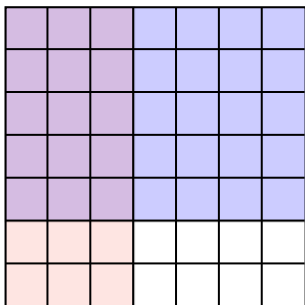
1) $\frac{6}{8} \times \frac{1}{4} =$



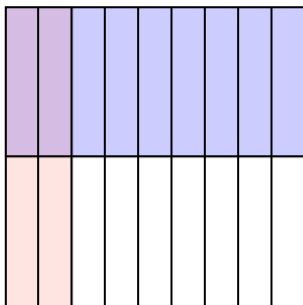
2) $\frac{3}{9} \times \frac{3}{4} =$



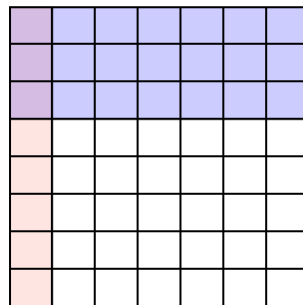
3) $\frac{3}{7} \times \frac{5}{7} =$



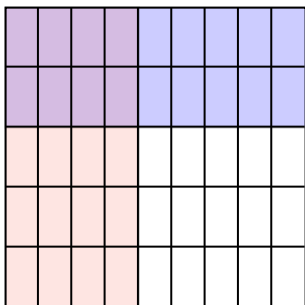
4) $\frac{2}{9} \times \frac{1}{2} =$



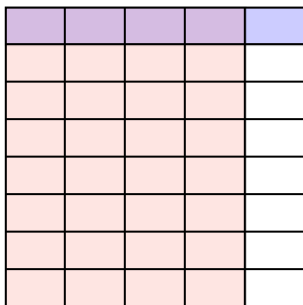

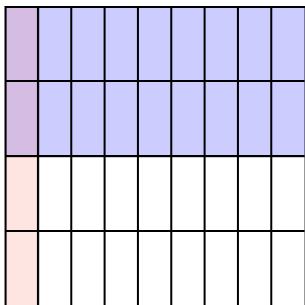
